Applicant must also meet the following admission criteria:

- Be unconditionally admitted to the College.
- Be in good standing with the College.
- Submit nursing application and supporting documentation before posted deadline.
- Any courses in progress must be completed before the application deadline to qualify for admission points.
- Maintain a grade of "C" or better in ALL general education and nursing courses.
- A minimum GPA of 2.0 cumulative at current native institution or 2.0 cumulative at institution from which student is transferring is required.
- A minimum GPA of 2.5 is necessary for nursing required academic courses.
- A minimum GPA of 2.5 cumulative from high school is required for students without prior college courses (GED will be used if applicable).
- Be eligible for MTH 100 – Intermediate College Algebra (higher level math accepted) and Biology 201 A & P I.
- A minimum 18 ACT composite score or superscore (National or Residual).

Applicant must meet the following before final program admission:

- Essential functions: Applicant must possess a functional level of ability to perform the duties required of a nurse.
- Clinical Requirements including immunizations, health insurance, access to transportation, background check and drug and alcohol screening.

Wallace State Nursing Program requires a minimum ACT score of 18 (composite or superscore) regardless of date taken for the ADN and PN Program.

To obtain ACT test scores, check high school transcript or order the results from ACT. On the ACT website search for: Sending Your Scores, then follow the directions. The test scores will be sent to Wallace State Community College (Center Code 0083).
